Drink-Drive Killer latest

Message from Nich....

Having spent some time looking in to this it would appear there are some misleading aspects of the newspaper reporting and Neil's proposed plan.

The maximum sentence applicable to this case is far lower than the newspaper and Neil have said (the driver would have had to have shown a much higher level of alcohol in their blood).

By repeating the line supplied by the papers and Neil, the suggested PR I sent round earlier was not so much 'limp' as over-inflated.

Borrett's sentence falls within the definitive guideline set by the Sentencing Guidelines Council:

1. the driver received the minimum jail sentence for the amount of alcohol in his blood, ie; 3 years. The maximum sentence would have been either 7, 8 or 9 years depending on how the vehicle was being driven, not 14 years.
2. the driver received the maximum disqualification period, also 3 years, as laid down in the definitive guidance. A lifetime ban isn't on the menu.

That leaves us with a weaker case for asking the Director of Public Prosecutions to review the sentence and hang the driver out to dry - that's 'weaker', NOT 'no case' (like everybody else my gut wants to see 7, 8 or 9 years as the sentence).

It might look like a much stronger story and recruitment opportunity if we deliberately span the message about the maximum sentence that this driver could have had; demanded the vile, remorseless, arrogant Borrett be left to rot; and also painted the court as biased toward middle-class drivers - or it might just look like naked exploitation of a tragic story.

It's up to the NC to decide whether we should be attacking the individual, or the judgement, or the official policy on sentencing killers. But, if we are serious about changing this appalling situation then we have to ask whether we really want to start by winding people-up with inaccurate claims and emotional out-pourings capable of turning an open goal in to an own goal (even a drag-artist can grasp the off-side rule:-)).

Partnership owns up to motorcycle viral

Thames Valley Safer Roads Partnership (TVSRP) has revealed that it was behind a viral video about a 'Crashproof motorbike', which has attracted more than four million online views.

The viral film was created as part of the Safer Rider campaign to get more riders to take part in advanced training, in particular men in their mid 30s to early 40s due to high casualty rates in this age group.

Craig McAlpine, of TVSRP, said: "Our aim was to produce a video that encouraged people to discuss the attitudes and ability involved when riding a motorcycle, and for it to spread virally within the motorcycle community.

"Crashproof Motorbike achieved this and the comments we have seen on motorcycle forums demonstrate that the underlying message has been clear.

"Encouraging people to look into advanced riding skills is the key message we would like to push out via the Safer Rider website, and of course ultimately to reduce the number of casualties."

TVSRP says the key message in the video is: "It doesn't matter how good your bike is, a well trained rider is paramount."

Inspector Bob Jarret, of Thames Valley Police, said: "Motorcyclists are still massively over represented in the casualty figures. Time and time again we are seeing the same mistakes as contributory factors in these collisions which could so easily be avoided.

"That's why we are encouraging riders to get extra training and learn additional skills. Ultimately people will get more out of their riding and it will help them to stay safe."
